BLACK-LED ORGANIZATIONS TO RESPOND TO VIOLENCE AGAINST BLACK PEOPLE

Digital Press Conference to be Held in Response to Black Deaths in Canada and the USA

On **Thursday, June 04, 2020, from 1:30 pm to 2:30 pm** via **Zoom**, the African Communities of Manitoba Inc. (ACOMI) in partnership with Black History Month Celebration Committee (BHMCC), Black Space Winnipeg, Congress of Black Women of Manitoba (COBW), and Caribbean Council Organization of Manitoba (CCOM) will be hosting a press conference to respond to the recent police violence against Black people in Canada and the United States of America (U.S.A.).

In 2015, the United Nations declared the decade for people of African descent proclaiming that in this decade, there needs to be a global focus on the recognition, justice, and development of and with people of African descent. However, recent and ongoing events have proven that one of these areas, justice, is not, and has not been on the minds of individuals and governments around the world. As we continue to see the ongoing oppression and violence that is inflicted on Black people internationally, we grow wearier and more restless for honest change in our communities.

It is naive to assume that this is an American-only problem. The deaths of Machuar Madut (Winnipeg), Regis Korchinski-Paquet (Toronto), and George Floyd (Minneapolis) are three out of the many ongoing tragedies that we continue to see in Black communities. Fueled by bigotry, racial profiling, and systemic racism, Black-led and Black-supporting organizations are calling for an end to the violence that we continue to see against Black people. We are calling on all levels of government and individuals outside of the Black community to educate themselves and evaluate their impact on the injustices that we see every day.

This needs to stop, now. Racial inequality impacts us all. We continue to recognize the need to have safe cities, spaces, and systems for members of the community of people of African descent in Canada, in the USA, and around the world. We have provided the education, resources, and knowledge – it is out there – it is now time for those outside the community to take action against the violence we are seeing and to choose change.
